Set a positive example in our words and in our behaviors.

- We can't really expect our athletes to exercise good sportsmanship if we are screaming and yelling from the sidelines. Take the time to think about how you are coming off to others before acting and reacting to important moments in the game.
- Teach your athletes how to both win and lose gracefully, and how important it is to treat the other team with respect no matter what the outcome.

This means that you should always assume that your athletes are watching you and learning from your behavior. Remember that lessons learned in sports are often carried to other aspects of our lives.
